<u>Galatians 5:1</u> (NIV84) It is for <u>freedom</u> that Christ has set us <u>free</u>. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

Practical consequences of your choices:

I. Door #1: Choose . Galatians 5:2 (NIV84) Mark my words! I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. A. Trying to earn God's favor through conformity nullifies any practical benefit of Christ's sacrifice. Galatians 5:3-4 (NIV84) Again I declare to every man who lets himself be circumcised that he is obligated to obey the whole law. 4 You who are trying to be justified by law have been <u>alienated</u> from Christ; you have fallen away from grace. B. Trying to earn God's favor by your good _____ means you must obey the Law perfectly; you can never sin. James 2:10 (NIV84) For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one **point** is guilty of breaking all of it. Romans 6:23 (NIV84) For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Titus 5:5a (NIV84) He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. II. Door #2: Choose Galatians 5:5 (NIV84) But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope. A. Placing your faith in Jesus gives you freedom to _____. Ephesians 2:12-13 (NIV84) Remember that at that time you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world.
