
Two Theories of Origins


Earth formed from debris orbiting around our sun about <u>4.5</u> billion years ago.






According to the conventional hypothesis, the earliest living cells emerged as a result of chemical evolution on our planet about 3.7 billion years ago in a process called abiogenesis.

Creation: The Creation of the universe came about just as the Word of God described; it was a six-day Creation event. The true age of the earth (and all of the physical universe) is measured in thousands (not billions) of years (Genesis 1-11). Mankind began with two individuals who came into being through a special, personal, creative act of God (Genesis 2).

GENESIS 5:1-5

This is the book of the generations of Adam. When God created man, he made him in the likeness of God. 3 When Adam had lived 130 years, he fathered a son in his own likeness, after his image, and named him Seth. 4 The days of Adam after he fathered Seth were 800 years; and he had other sons and daughters. 5 Thus all the days that Adam lived were 930 years, and he died.

GENESIS 5:6-8

When Seth had lived 105 years, he fathered Enosh. 7 Seth lived after he fathered Enosh 807 years and had other sons and daughters. 8 Thus all the days of Seth were 912 years, and he died.

130 + 105 = 235

GENESIS 5:9-11

When Enosh had lived <u>90 years</u>, he fathered Kenan. 10 Enosh lived after he fathered Kenan 815 years and had other sons and daughters. 11 Thus all the days of Enosh were 905 years, and he died.

235 + 90 = 325

GENESIS 5:12-14

When Kenan had lived 70 years, he fathered Mahalalel. 13 Kenan lived after he fathered Mahalalel 840 years and had other sons and daughters. 14 Thus all the days of Kenan were 910 years, and he died.

325 + 70 = 395

GENESIS 5:15-17

When Mahalalel had lived <u>65 years</u>, he fathered Jared. 16 Mahalalel lived after he fathered Jared 830 years and had other sons and daughters. 17 Thus all the days of Mahalalel were 895 years, and he died.

395 + 65 = 460

GENESIS 5:18-20

When Jared had lived 162 years, he fathered Enoch. 19 Jared lived after he fathered Enoch 800 years and had other sons and daughters. 20 Thus all the days of Jared were 962 years, and he died.

460 + 162 = 622

GENESIS 5:21-24

When Enoch had lived <u>65 years</u>, he fathered Methuselah. 22 Enoch walked with God after he fathered Methuselah 300 years and had other sons and daughters. 23 Thus all the days of Enoch were 365 years. 24 Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him.

622 + 65 = 687

GENESIS 5:25-27

When Methuselah had lived 187 years, he fathered Lamech. 26 Methuselah lived after he fathered Lamech 782 years and had other sons and daughters. 27 Thus all the days of Methuselah were 969 years, and he died.

687 + 187 = 874

GENESIS 5:28-31

When Lamech had lived 182 years, he fathered a son 29 and called his name Noah, saying, "Out of the ground that the Lord has cursed, this one shall bring us relief from our work and from the painful toil of our hands." 30 Lamech lived after he fathered Noah 595 years and had other sons and daughters. 31 Thus all the days of Lamech were 777 years, and he died.

874 + 182 = 1056

GENESIS 5:32

After Noah was <u>500 years</u> old, Noah fathered Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

1056 + 502 = 1558

GENESIS 11:10-11

These are the generations of Shem. When Shem was 100 years old, he fathered Arpachshad two years after the flood. 11 And Shem lived after he fathered Arpachshad 500 years and had other sons and daughters.

1558 + 100 = 1658

GENESIS 11:12-13

When Arpachshad had lived <u>35 years</u>, he fathered Shelah. 13 And Arpachshad lived after he fathered Shelah 403 years and had other sons and daughters.

1663 + 35 = 1693

GENESIS 11:14-15

When Shelah had lived 30 years, he fathered Eber. 15 And Shelah lived after he fathered Eber 403 years and had other sons and daughters.

1693 + 30 = 1723

GENESIS 11:16-17

When Eber had lived 34 years, he fathered Peleg. 17 And Eber lived after he fathered Peleg 430 years and had other sons and daughters.

1723 + 34 = 1757

GENESIS 11:18-19

When Peleg had lived 30 years, he fathered Reu. 19 And Peleg lived after he fathered Reu 209 years and had other sons and daughters.

1757 + 30 = 1787

GENESIS 11:20-21

When Reu had lived <u>32 years</u>, he fathered Serug. 21 And Reu lived after he fathered Serug 207 years and had other sons and daughters.

1787 + 32 = 1819

GENESIS 11:22-23

When Serug had lived <u>30 years</u>, he fathered Nahor. 23 And Serug lived after he fathered Nahor 200 years and had other sons and daughters.

1819 + 30 = 1849

GENESIS 11:24-25

When Nahor had lived <u>29 years</u>, he fathered Terah. 25 And Nahor lived after he fathered Terah 119 years and had other sons and daughters.

1849 + 29 = 1878

GENESIS 11:26

When Terah had lived <u>70 years</u>, he fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran.

1878 + 70 = 1948







- Question: What is the oldest writing we can date without having to use Carbon 14 dating?
- ▲ Answer: For cuneiform, we can securely date using a solar eclipse observed in 763 BC. Before that, we rely on less secure methods such as historical records of various sorts. That gets us back to about 1400 BC. Before that, we are less sure still. There are periods of time of known length that float in uncertain relationship to each other.








What causes aging and death?

- -Your cells regenerate every 7-10 years on average.
- -Possible causes of aging and death: disease, diet, wear and tear, and other environmental factors.
- -But it appears there is an upper limit written into our genetic code.
- -It is known that ordinary human cells divided about 80-90 times. (This is thought to be related to the telomere on the end of our chromosomes.)

Noah's descendants were undergoing some type of rapid degenerative process. There is now very strong evidence that humans are degenerating genetically, and have been for thousands of years, due to continuously accumulating mutations. This makes it very reasonable to conclude that the systematic degeneration of man that is documented in the Bible was due to mutation accumulation and resultant genetic entropy.
