## **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:**

- What emotions arise when you reflect on the cross? (Gratitude, guilt, awe, confusion) Share with one another.
- How does the graphic details of Jesus' suffering change the way you view sin and grace?

- What does the cross reveal about the holiness of God and His inability to overlook sin? What does it reveal about His mercy and grace?
- In your own words, why do we often treat sin so lightly when it cost Jesus so dearly?
- Does Jesus being treated as the "most sinful one" change the way you view your own sin?
- What's harder for you to believe: that Jesus sees all your sin and shame or that He loves you and calls you His?
- The Great Exchange in 2 Corinthians 5:21 is radical: Our sin for His righteousness. Share with one another some additional verses that reminds us of our identity in Christ.
- Share with one another three people that you'd like to invite to come to church with you for Easter. Pray for them and invite them!
